Professional guide Craig has 35 years of fly fishing experience. He also has 20 years service with the New Zealand Police as a search and rescue member and instructor in Hawke's Bay. Marlene has 25 years experience and is credited with teaching fly fishing and river safety in schools. Guide Morris Hill adds even more years of professional guiding skills.

At home in New Zealand, this trio of experienced local fly fishing guides can provide a wide range of fishing opportunities from Hawke's Bay's renowned river systems of the Mohaka, Ngaruroro, Tuki Tuki, Tutaekuri, Ruakaturi and their tributary streams.

A helicopter wilderness trip is a 'must do' to experience true mountain fly fishing. The helicopter scenic flight alone is breathtaking, the challenge of catching big trout in emerald pools nerve-racking, and the remote wilderness peace unforgettable.

For non fishing partners, Marlene is on hand to teach you the art of fly fishing, or there are many other options such as winery tours, Maori cultural experiences, shopping, galleries or just relaxation by the Cape South pool.

STYLE OF FISHING IN NEW ZEALAND

Site fishing first then making that vital cast in all small streams. Streams have water clarity that surpasses many world fisheries. Big river fishing hosts enormous trophy trout and site fishing will occur first then blind fishing to where your guide knows where the trout are laying in the deeper parts.

River conditions are normally excellent throughout the whole season as the watershed supports a high number fishing area's but travel outside the district may occur if conditions change. Your guides will make the appropriate choices

Equipment we provide:

- ◆ **Rods** - We supply and use nine-foot, #5,#6,#7, and #8-weight rods
- ◆ **Tackle, trout flies** - We supply all tackle as and when required.
- ◆ **General trout patterns** - More often than not clients will bring their own flies, here are some general patterns that catch trout in New Zealand.
- ◆ **Nymph & Caddis patterns** - 16,14,12 Gold bead heads, pheasant tail, hare & coppers, olive caddis, green & black stone flies
- ◆ **Dry fly patterns** - 16,14, 12 Royal Wulff, Adams, Elk hair caddis 8, Cicada size 8,10
- ◆ **Licences** - we do have licences available for supply:
 - 24hr Adult 18 years and over \$21.00, Junior 12 to 17 years \$4.00
 - Whole season Adult \$105.00 Winter Adult \$63.00
 - Whole season Junior \$21.00 Winter Junior \$13.00
- ◆ **Vehicles** - we have two comfortable and clean 4x4 drive vehicles

What you need to bring:

- ◆ **Waders** - can be purchased here, but if you cannot source a pair we do have a limited selection of sizes
- ◆ **Recommended wading boots** - boots with a rubber sole and in accordance with New Zealand Fish and Game laws
- ◆ **Gloves** - wool or synthetic-winter
- ◆ **Sun protection** - wearing long sleeved shirt with a high collar to protect your neck.
- ◆ **Insect repellent** - can be purchased here
- ◆ **Polarized sunglasses**- a must and single most important item. Wide brimmed hat is essential for hot, sunny days
- ◆ **Wading Stick** - if you are unsure of your footing and require support, then a collapsible wading stick is ideal
- ◆ **Camera** - and water proof bag
- ◆ **Fly lines in dull tones** - If you want to bring your own/olive, camel or grey are best Leave any bright coloured fly lines at home.
- ◆ **Dull coloured clothing** - olive green, brown, grey will help reduce trout spooking
- ◆ **Personal Medication** - let your guide know and carry it with you at all times

BOOKING CONDITIONS

◆ Please book your New Zealand fly fishing trip well in advance for your travel and book as many days as you can. Booking the trip of a lifetime for two days can be difficult to achieve if weather conditions do not permit. It's also good to have a day to adjust to the New Zealand's style of fishing. Book at least 6 months a head of time to secure your trip.

Cancelled bookings are extremely difficult to fill at short notice and our season of fly fishing is our living so we need to cover ourselves for lost days. We require this commitment from clients booking. Once you confirm your booking, please forward a 30% non refundable deposit.

Cancellations within two weeks of fishing dates - 50% cancellation fee applies for all fishing days booked.

Cancellations within one week of fishing dates - 100% cancellation fee applies for all fishing days booked.
